MATHS

Number & Place Value

Counting, ordering, comparing numbers to 20 and beyond. Adding and subtracting 1 or 10.



Addition & Subtraction

Number stories for addition or subtraction facts, doubles and counting on/ back 1. Number facts representing addition and subtraction with concrete objects.

2D shapes

2D shapes: identifying, naming and sorting according to different properties.

Position and direction

Establishing position and direction and then comparing and measuring lengths.

SCIENCE

Animals including Humans:



Children will learn to identify, name and label parts of the human body; to know which part of the body is associated with each of the five senses; to identify and name a variety of animals and to describe and compare the structure of common animals. Lastly, the children will use their senses to construct an investigation.

COMPUTING

Programming Toys



In this unit the children will be introduced to the principles of programming through unplugged tasks and the use of Bee-Bots.

They will be introduced to algorithms as a step by step instruction given to a device. They will learn how to debug simple algorithms and how to use logical reasoning to predict how a program will behave.

HUMANITIES

'What's it like where we live?'

Children will learn about plans and maps, landmarks in the local area and local journeys.



PSHE

Healthy life-style:

In this unit children will learn about how they can keep their bodies safe. They will understand the difference between physical and mental health and examples of each type of health. They will be able to understand how they can contribute to getting better and how other adults can look after them if they are not well.



P.E

The children will master basic movements including: running, jumping, throwing and catching. Children will then use these movements in a game of Bench ball.
