Theme: The Ancient World

ENGLISH

The children will compare a range of myths. They will analyse a quest myth, identifying the text structure and language features. They will identify how settings impact on events in a quest myth. After which they will create an interactive story map to support planning a quest myth. Children will retell the quest myth by incorporating the features and plot structure of a myth. They then begin to plan for their own quests. They will write their own quest myth incorporating settings that provide a challenge and settings with characters that support the main character.

SCIENCE

This unit focuses on the changes that human beings experience as they develop to old age. Children will learn about the life cycle of a human being. They will investigate the development of babies and compare the gestation period of humans and other animals. The final investigation will be about the changes to the body as humans get older, as well as comparing the life expectancy of different animals.

MATHS

This half term we will be adding and subtracting decimals within 1. Adding and subtracting wholes and decimals. Multiplying decimals by 10, 100 and 1,000. Dividing decimals by 10, 100 and 1,000.

We will then move on to looking at angles, measuring angles. The children will learn about the types of triangles and polygons.

Then we will move on to looking at position and translation.

ART

William Morris

The children learn to identify William Morris. Children then make their own print, refine and develop it and finally create a finished piece.

QURAN

Memorisation: Surah Abasa (completion)

Revision: Previous surahs

Recitation: Continue Quran recitation based on individual ability.

HUMANITIES

The children will learn who the ancient Maya people were and where and when they lived. They will use maps and atlases to locate Maya cities and identify countries in Mesoamerica. In addition to this they will learn about the religious beliefs and rituals of the ancient Maya people and find out more about some of the many gods they worshipped. The children will also learn about the Maya number system and have the opportunity to read and write Maya numbers and solve number problems. They will learn about the Maya writing system too and practise writing words using logograms and syllabograms in the hieroglyphic style of the ancient Maya people. The children will learn about the work of the explorers John Lloyd Stephens and Frederick Catherwood and have the opportunity to analyse historical pictures of the cities they discovered. They will also learn about the types of food eaten by the ancient Maya people and they will find out about the significance of corn and chocolate, arguing which was most important in a class debate.

COMPUTING

Programming with Micro:bit: This half term we focus on improving our programming skills and computational thinking using physical devices like Micro:bit. Physical computing involves interactive systems that can sense and respond to the world around them. Students will be able to continue learning about main programming construct, as well as practice them using the block based visual programming language.

URDU

Topic...Food - Khana

Different types of food, naming food/dishes, favourite dish, cold/hot food, breakfast, lunch, dinner, making statements about food, past tense.

Read, translate and write sentences, punctuation and correct pronunciation, comprehension activities related to the topic, counting numbers & individual target.

PSHE

This unit is inspired by the idea that we are all individuals and that it is important to 'be yourself'. It aims to encourage the children to develop a positive view of themselves and enable them to recognise the importance of being proud of their individuality. In this unit, children focus on the importance of recognising situations where they need to make positive choices in order to do the right thing. They also explore how to avoid being led into tricky situations and how to recognise and respond to peer pressure. The unit ends by helping the children to investigate how to make things right when they make a mistake.
