
MATHEMATICS

Addition and Subtraction (within 20)

- Find and make number bonds.
- Add numbers within 20 using knowledge of number bonds
- Subtraction within 20.
- Addition and subtraction fact families for numbers within 20.
- Compare number sentences within 20 using inequality symbols.

Place Value (within 50)

- Counting forwards and backwards within 50
- Partition numbers using tens and ones.
- One more and one less than given numbers up to 50.
- Compare numbers within 50 using inequality symbols.
- Order numbers using language: largest, smallest, more than, less than, least, most and equal to.
- Counting in 2s and 5s up to 50



ENGLISH

Fiction: Once Upon a Time

In this unit, the children explore a range of fiction and fairy tales. They will explore the texts, listening and responding to the stories then re-telling them in their own words. Pupils will learn how to identify and understand character and events, linking these to their own lives and experiences. They compose and write simple sentences and questions.

Texts in this unit:

- Mary and the Twelve Months
- The Four Singers Word Detectives

Word Detectives

Children take on the role of word detectives to investigate spelling patterns and generate their own spelling rules. ☐ Explore regular plural noun suffixes ('-s' and '-es') ☐

Introduce the terms singular and plural and the concepts behind them.

Learn the spelling rule for regular plural noun endings ☐ Syllables ☐ Suffixes '-ing', '-ed', '-er' and '-est'



SCIENCE

Everyday material


Introduction This 'Everyday Materials' unit will teach your class about everyday materials including wood, plastic, metal, water and rock. Children will learn to identify and name everyday materials and will have the opportunity to explore the properties of these materials. Children also will carry out a simple investigation to help them decide which material would be most suitable to use for an umbrella. At the end of the unit children apply their knowledge of everyday materials to sort objects by their properties. A range of learning activities are used in this unit including, discussions, labelling and matching activities, games, and an investigation to encourage where children have the opportunity to ask and find the answers to questions.

HUMANITIES

This unit gives a geographical context to children's interests in, and prior knowledge of, animals through a study of five continents. It looks at pandas, penguins, sharks and elephants, as well as lesser-known birds, such as the swallow. The unit also focuses the children on specific landscapes, people and issues associated with real places. It starts by showing what these animals' homes are like and addressing misconceptions they might have. It offers a chance to introduce North and South America, which is studied in the KS2 Geography Programme of Study.



ART



This Fabric Bunting unit will teach your class about working with fabric. It starts with children evaluating a range of existing bunting with a theme around counting. Children are then set a design criteria. They will learn how to use a graphics program to create a design and template for their bunting. Working with felt, children will cut out a bunting shape and use a simple running stitch. Children will be given the chance to explore different fabrics that they could use to enhance their designs. Using techniques such as sewing, stapling and gluing, children will decorate their felt flag. Finally, children will evaluate their product.



PSHE

Money Matters

This unit encourages children to think about where money comes from and how it can be used. Children will discuss the ideas of spending and saving and begin to understand why it is important to keep belongings. They will also learn about the different things on offer when they go shopping and how we need to identify the difference between the things we want and the things we need.

PE

Gymnastics: Traditional tales

This unit of gymnastics provides opportunities for children to learn and practise a variety of skills, including travelling movements, rolls, jumps and balances. Each lesson is based on a different traditional tale and uses the characters and story ideas to provide opportunities for children to develop control, agility and coordination. During the unit, children apply their learning in a variety of ways, including regular sequence building, both individually and with a partner. Self and peer assessment is used regularly to allow children to monitor their progress and build on their previous learning.

COMPUTING



Computer Skills

This Painting unit will teach your class basic painting skills in a painting application on a computer or tablet device. Children will use a simple painting program to paint with different colours and brushes, create shapes, fill areas, undo and redo and add text.
