



Theme

Marvellous Metals











Writing – Our writing this term will be based on 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes; a part modern fairy-tale, part science-fiction myth. Children will be writing character descriptions, news reports, letters, diary entries, menus and logbook entries. The sessions will culminate in them writing a mystery narrative.

Grammar:

- Adding clarity and detail to sentences by adding fronted adverbials
- Expanding noun phrases by adding modifying adjectives, nouns and prepositions
- Using inverted commas for direct speech and a comma after the reporting clause
- Using commas after fronted adverbials
- Indicating possession by using the possessive apostrophe with plural nouns



- Find equivalent lengths m and cm, mm and cm
- Learn about kilometres
- Adding and subtracting lengths
- Measuring perimeter
- Finding perimeter on a grid
- Finding perimeter of a rectangle or rectilinear shape
- Multiply and divide by 10 and 100
- Multiply by 1 and 0
- Divide by 1 and itself
- Multiply and divide by 3, 6, 7 and 9



In this unit about electricity, Year 4 will learn about common electrical appliances and how to construct simple series circuits. They will become familiar with the key words linked to the topic and how to apply them appropriately. Children will learn about cells, wires, bulbs and buzzers and about the different types of switches. They will be able to troubleshoot and identify whether or not a bulb will light in a simple series circuit and be able to identify a complete circuit. The children will also learn about conductors and insulators and know that metals are very good electrical conductors.

S1DO

The Bronze Age and the Iron Age

In this unit, the children will explore the key features of the Bronze and Iron Ages, and come to conclusions about how difficult life was. They look at the developments that were made during the periods and discuss which made the biggest impact on the standard of living.



<u>**Computing**</u>

Creating media - Audio production

Children will learn to identify that sound can be recorded and explain that audio recordings can be edited. They will be able to recognise the different parts of creating a podcast project and learn to apply audio editing skills independently. Children will learn to combine audio to enhance 'my podcast project' and evaluate the effective use of audio. They will discuss the impact of a podcast and the responsibilities and consequences of such audio uses.





In this unit of work, children will consider what it means to take responsibility for their own safety. This will include the decisions they make and how they can stand up to peer pressure in a range of situations. They will learn about everyday risks, hazards and dangers and what to do in risky or dangerous situations. They will also learn about road, water and rail safety. Children will look at first aid, exploring how to deal with common injuries and what to do to respond to emergency situations.
