

Theme



Britain and Beyond









In our writing unit, we will create some short writing pieces based on the book: *The Lizzie and Bell Mysteries.* Throughout the unit, Year 5 will create posters, write short diary entries, write letters and character descriptions. This will also lead towards our final writing piece which will be a biography based on Ignatius Sancho.

<u>Grammar-</u> Through the above writing units, we will cover various grammatical terms such as relative clauses, parenthesis and expanded noun phrases. We will also explore the difference between a formal and an informal tone.





In our multiplication topic, Year 5 will investigate multiples, factors, prime numbers, square numbers and cube numbers. They will also look for patterns when multiplying and dividing numbers by 10, 100 and 1000.

We will also look at perimeter and area, differentiating between the two. We will look at measuring and calculating perimeter, thinking about how both are different. We will also look at ways in which we can find the area of rectangles, compound shapes and irregular shapes.

Creating media - Video production.



Children will learn to explain what makes a video effective and identify digital devices that can record



video. They will learn to capture video using a range of techniques and create a storyboard. Children will work on identifying that video can be improved through reshooting and editing and consider the impact of the choices made when making and sharing a video. They will discuss the responsibilities and consequences linked to creating, sharing and watching videos online.

Science

This 'Living Things and Their Habitats' unit will teach the children about the process of reproduction and the life cycles of plants, mammals, amphibians, insects and birds. The children will explore reproduction in different plants, including different methods of pollination and reproduction. They will recap their work by playing a game to name the parts of a flower. The children will have the opportunity to take cuttings from plants, creating clones of the parent plant. They will learn about different types of mammals and their different life cycles, making life cycle wheels to present their learning. Furthermore, the children will find out about Jane Goodall and her work with the now-endangered chimpanzees in Africa. They will explore metamorphosis in insects and amphibians, comparing their life cycles.

Geography

In Geography, we will be exploring the question: How is the UK changing? Children will find out bout the regions of the UK, discovering how some of these areas have changed over time. The children will research how specific areas of the UK have been affected by change, before conducting a fieldwork activity on their own area, writing a magazine article and working towards a final art piece representing change in their local area.

PHSE & RS

This PSHE unit is inspired by the idea that Britain represents a wide range of faiths and ethnicities and that the structures within it are there to support all. It aims to enable the children to identify how they can make a positive contribution to the community. In this unit, children learn about the law and the consequences of not respecting it. They will also learn about the workings of local and national government and the role of charities and voluntary groups in British society.

This RS unit will allow children to explore some of the financial inequalities in the world and look at how some people believe it is right to try to change this. They will look at some current issues and think about their own views on the importance of money in comparison to other things.

This Plants and Flowers unit will teach the children about how to use pencil, colour, Hapa-Zome printing, sculpture and paper modelling to create quality art work that shows progression in their skills. The children will also have the opportunity to explore the work of India Flint, Alexander Calder, David Oliveira and Henri Rousseau.
