

Text: The Odd Egg

The children will begin by identifying different types of eggs and predict who they might belong to. Then they will explore the text and link it to Science e.g. animals and their young. The final outcome, the children will make a non-fiction 'Egg Spotter's Guide' after researching different types of eggs from the book.

<u>Grammar:</u>

Topic: Seasonal changes (Spring and Summer)

The children will continue to use a class weather station to observe, measure and record the weather in different seasons and will start to make comparisons between two seasons, as well as across all four seasons. They will also observe changes across the seasons by exploring the signs of spring and summer through nature and wildlife. A range of learning activities are used in this unit, including observation, discussion and learning outside. Children will also work scientifically by collecting, recording and interpreting simple data.



In this unit, the children will explore similarities and differences between their own lives and those of people their grandparents' age. The unit focuses on different topics, including homes, toys, shops and schools.

In this unit, the children will:

- develop an awareness of the past
- know where the people and events they study fit within a chronological framework
- identify similarities and differences between ways of life in different periods
- use a wide vocabulary of everyday historical terms
- ask and answer questions, choosing parts of sources to show that they know and understand key features
- understand some of the ways in which we find out about the past

Yoga – 'Salute to the Sun'

The Salute to the Sun unit for Year 1 will teach the children a yoga sequence which comprises of a full range of movements and incorporates forward bends, backbends, inversions, twists and balances. Each week, children will develop the sequence and refine their movements. The context of planting a sunflower is used to help encourage children to move creatively. As the unit progresses, children will expand their range of yoga poses and how they transition between them. Children will then work with a partner to create their own sequence and lead yoga poses.





Health and Wellbeing

This unit explores choices that children can make about looking after their bodies. The lessons look at key areas: sleep, exercise, diet, cleanliness, keeping safe in the sun and recognising the importance of knowing when to take a break from time online or TV. Children will learn facts about each of these areas and learn strategies to manage them.



Landscapes and Cityscapes

This Fabric Bunting unit will teach the class about working with fabric. It starts with children evaluating a range of existing bunting. Children are then set a design criterion to create a design and template for their bunting. The theme will be Ramadan/Eid. Working with felt, children will cut out a bunting shape and use a simple running stitch. Children will be given the chance to explore different fabrics that they could use to enhance their designs. Using techniques such as sewing, stapling and gluing, children will decorate their felt flag. Finally, children will evaluate their product.



Word Processing Skills

Children will learn how to type with two hands, use the shift, space and enter key properly, and edit work by using the backspace, delete and arrow keys. Children will then go on to learn how to use undo and redo and to select and format text.
