Online Safety Assembly – Reception, Year 1 and Year 2
We held an online safety assembly on Wednesday for pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. It is impossible to start too early these days when it comes to teaching children how to stay safe online.

When I asked pupils who plays games on a device, the majority raised their hands. This is a reminder of how early children are being exposed to online spaces. While technology can be beneficial, we are all aware of the very real dangers that adults online can pose to young children.

If your child is permitted to use a device at home, the most effective safety measure is you. Children should always be supervised when using devices, ideally in a shared family space. Devices should never be used unsupervised or in a separate room.

Online safety is an ongoing responsibility that works best when schools and parents work together to protect our pupils, insha'Allah.

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
HIGHLIGHTS OF THE WEEK
