Job Title: Computing Teacher
Responsible To: Headteacher

Job Purpose:

To plan, deliver and assess high-quality Computing lessons across Key Stages 1 and 2, promoting digital literacy, computational thinking, creativity and responsible use of technology. The successful candidate will support pupils in developing confidence and competence across a range of computing skills including coding, digital media, online safety and information technology, while contributing positively to the wider ethos and values of the school.

Key Responsibilities:

- Plan and deliver engaging and differentiated Computing lessons in line with the school curriculum and National Curriculum requirements.
- Teach pupils a range of computing skills including coding, algorithms, digital media, online safety and computing systems and networks.
- Promote high standards of digital literacy, creativity and computational thinking across the primary phase.
- Develop pupils' understanding of online safety and responsible use of technology through regular online safety teaching and reinforcement.
- Adapt teaching effectively to meet the needs of all pupils, including those with SEND, EAL and differing abilities.
- Use a range of assessment strategies to monitor progress, provide feedback and support pupils' development in Computing.
- Support pupils in developing confidence using software and digital tools, including Word, PowerPoint, Scratch, Bee Bots, Micro:bits and other educational technologies.
- Create a positive, safe and stimulating learning environment which encourages curiosity, independence and resilience.
- Maintain high expectations of behaviour, effort and presentation in lessons.
- Work collaboratively with teachers and support staff to promote cross-curricular use of technology and computing skills.
- Support school initiatives relating to online safety, safeguarding and digital wellbeing.
- Contribute to the wider life of the school, including themed days, enrichment opportunities and extracurricular activities where appropriate.
- Ensure computing equipment and resources are used safely, effectively and in accordance with school policies.
- Take responsibility for promoting and safeguarding the welfare of children and young people within the school



Essential Requirements:

- Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) in the UK.
- Experience teaching Computing or delivering aspects of Computing within a primary school setting.
- Good knowledge of the primary Computing curriculum and online safety requirements.
- Confidence using a range of educational technology and digital platforms.
- Excellent communication, organisation and classroom management skills.
- A commitment to high standards of teaching, learning and pupil achievement
- A strong commitment to safeguarding, wellbeing and pastoral care.

Other

- To have professional regard for the ethos, policies and practices of the school in which you teach, and maintain high standards in your own attendance and punctuality.
- Perform any reasonable duties as requested by the Headteacher.
- Attend all after-school meetings or, where part-time, attend meetings on agreed working days.
- Attend end-of-year celebrations.

Desirable:

- Experience teaching coding platforms such as Scratch, ScratchJr or LOGO.
- Experience using educational technology including Bee Bots or Micro:bits.
- Knowledge of effective strategies to support pupils with SEND and EAL in Computing lessons.
- Experience contributing to extracurricular clubs or enrichment activities related to technology or computing.
